generosity toward
other peoples.

Through personal
contacts and the
media, musical
diplomacy also
created subtle
musical, social,
and political
relationships on a
global scale.

Although born of
state-sponsored
tours often
conceived as
propaganda
ventures, these
relationships were
in themselves great

diplomatic achievements and constituted the essence of America's soft power. Using archival documents and newly collected oral histories, Danielle Fosler-Lussier shows that musical diplomacy had vastly different meanings for its various participants, including government officials, musicians, concert promoters, and audiences. Through the stories of musicians from Louis Armstrong and Marian Anderson to orchestras and college choirs,
